BSGAR LIVE SUMMER EVENT 2022

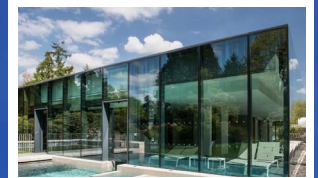
20TH - 21ST JUNE 2022
