

THE HALLIGAN RCR/ BSGAR TRAVELLING PROFESSORSHIP





The Halligan RCR/BSGAR Travelling Professorship

Professor Steve Halligan has been a bastion of gastrointestinal radiology throughout his clinical and academic career, and it is very worthy that BSGAR recognises his achievements through the naming of the Halligan RCR/BSGAR Travelling Professorship.

Steve is a superb educator and mentor. He has given numerous lectures and workshops both nationally and internationally and is always rated extremely highly by his audience for his unique style, clear messaging and depth of understanding. He is a natural communicator and enthusiast and has inspired a new generation of gastrointestinal radiologists, both clinical and academic. Mentoring his junior colleagues has always been a priority for him throughout his career and two of his previous fellows now hold full university chairs in Radiology as well as numerous others in clinical and research posts in high profile Radiology services in the UK and abroad.

He was an active clinician initially at St Mark's Hospital and subsequently at UCLH, setting high standards for the practice of clinical radiology both in his local departments but also nationally and internationally; he has led several consensus guidelines committees and advised numerous bodies around the practice of GI radiology.

Steve is one of the leading academic gastrointestinal (GI) radiologists in the world, and a clinical leader in his field with more than 400 publications and £5 million in personal grant income. His research is frequently published in high impact medical journals, such as the Lancet, which is unusual for a radiologist and testament to its impact. His work has fundamentally changed GI radiological practice in many areas. He led the landmark SIGGAR trials, providing randomised controlled trial evidence supporting widespread NHS implementation of CT Colonography and the withdrawal of the Barium Enema. He has also produced many of the seminal works informing imaging of the pelvic floor and perianal sepsis which continue to influence imaging guidelines. He collaborates widely with many disciplines notably health economists, statisticians and health psychologists and understanding and improving patient experience is at the heart of his work.

Steve is also a leader as past President of both the British and European Societies of Gastrointestinal and Abdominal Radiology and has sat on numerous high impact committees and boards including the NICE diagnostic advisory committee, NIHR commissioning and grant boards and is currently Chair of the National Screening Committee AI taskforce. He is an emeritus NIHR Senior Investigator and was elected Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences, both true makers of esteem and a very rare combination for a clinical radiologist.

Steve has been a constant source of support for BSGAR throughout his career and the BSGAR Committee takes great pleasure bestowing this honour on behalf of our members for his unique contribution to our speciality.

Professor Vicky Goh

Vicky Goh is Professor of Clinical Cancer Imaging and Honorary Consultant Radiologist at Kings College London and Guy's & St Thomas' Hospitals since 2011. She is Clinical Lead for the London Medical Imaging & Artificial Intelligence Centre for Value Based Healthcare, Principal Investigator for the Wellcome/EPSRC Centre for Medical Engineering and Imaging Co-Lead for

the National Institute for Health Research Biomedical Research Centre at Guy's & St Thomas' Hospitals.

Her comprehensive cancer focused research portfolio spans multi-modality, multiparametric imaging and biomarker development and novel functional imaging assessment for abdominopelvic, thoracic, and haematological cancers, producing 278 publications while providing support and mentoring for many researchers and students.

She is past President of the European Society of Oncologic Imaging, Steering committee member of the European School of Radiology, active member of many ESR and ESGAR subcommittees, and Academic Committee Chair at the Royal College of Radiologists and involved in NIHR and NCRI.

Vicky currently leads international guideline development for imaging in anorectal squamous carcinoma for ESGAR and she is a senior deputy editor for Radiology. Her clarity in teaching and depth of technical knowledge have been a hallmark at BSGAR and invited lectures at over 120 international meetings leading to an Honored Educator Award at RSNA 2023.

Professor Stuart Taylor

Stuart Taylor is Professor of Medical Imaging at University College London since 2011 and immediate past president of BSGAR from 2020-22. He is a leading international academic radiologist with particular focus on clinical trials in inflammatory bowel disease and colorectal cancer leading to £6 million grant funding as chief investigator and £11 million as a co-applicant.

His academic output with over 345 peer reviewed publications, numerous prizes and mentorship of successful junior researchers is matched by wider responsibilities as Co-director of the UCL Imaging Trials Unit and Chair of the NIHR Imaging Group and the Research Committee of ESGAR. He is Senior Editor for The British Journal of Radiology and on the editorial board of Radiology. Stuart's knowledge and leadership has been integral to international consensus guidelines for IBD and colorectal cancer imaging.

He is a consistently highly rated teacher and lecturer contributing to important conference scientific programmes and education initiatives related to CT colonography and bowel imaging for BSGAR and ESGAR. These achievements were recognised by his election to Fellowship of the Academy of Medical Sciences in 2022.

Dr Marc Zins

Marc Zins is the ESGAR president for 2023-25 and Chair of the Department of Radiology, Groupe Hospitalier Paris Saint Joseph, Paris since 2003. His breadth of clinically based research interests encompasses CT and MRI in abdominal disease, but his passion is for pancreatic and small bowel imaging with 166 peer reviewed publications.

He is President of the Scientific Council for Artificial Intelligence in Imaging in France and a Scientific Council member of the Curie Institute as well as associate editor for Radiology and Abdominal Radiology.

His teaching and knowledge are high prized with over 300 invited lectures and he is integral to French and European initiatives for developing training for junior radiologists, including the ESGAR Diploma for Gastrointestinal and Abdominal Radiology and the and the European Society of Radiology GI Curriculum.

Marc's contributions in France as President of the French Society of Abdominal Radiology (SIAD) and Vice President of French Society of Radiology (SFR) are exceeded by his numerous roles and responsibilities serving ESGAR on the executive committee since 2013 and positions for European Society of Radiology. He been recognised for these achievements by 3 National Radiology Societies and RSNA as an Honoured Educator.

BSGAR MEMBERSHIP



The following types of Membership to the British Society of GI and Abdominal Radiology (BSGAR) are available:

Full Membership and Junior Membership

Full membership is open, by application to the executive committee, to all consultant radiologists, non-consultant career grade radiologists and other consultants in allied specialities practicing in the United Kingdom who have a professed interest and practice in any aspect of abdominal or GI radiology. Junior membership is open to junior doctors and undergraduate medical students who have an interest in practising abdominal or GI radiology and are based in the United Kingdom.

All full and junior members have voting rights at the Annual General Meeting and are eligible for reduced registration fees at the BSGAR Annual Meeting and other BSGAR organised meetings/ workshops. In addition, they have full access to the BSGAR website, forum and CPD video library. Full and Junior membership fee is £50 to help cover administrative expenses.

Associate Membership

Associate membership is open, by application to the executive committee, to nurses and specialist radiographic practitioners with a significant role in GI and Abdominal Radiography. Associate members do not have voting rights at the Annual General Meeting but have full access to all members' only sections of the BSGAR website. We do wish to have active communications with all our professional colleagues, and encourage interaction in support of the Society's interests and the activities of its' full and junior members. The yearly membership fee is £25 to help cover administrative expenses.

Overseas Membership

Overseas membership and overseas associate membership are open, by application, to the executive committee. Overseas membership is open to practising or retired radiologists whose practice is based outside the United Kingdom and who have a special interest in GI Radiology. Overseas associate membership is open to nurses and specialist radiographic practitioners whose practice is based outside the United Kingdom and who spend the majority of their time in abdominal or GI radiology.

Overseas members have access to all educational material on the website but do not have voting rights at the Annual General Meeting nor access to the membership forum or database. There is a yearly membership fee to cover administrative expenses. The annual fee ranges from £1-£25 and will be determined in proportion to relative earnings in the applicant's country.











