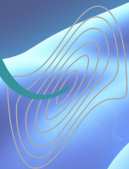

ORGANISED BY THE BIR EAST OF ENGLAND BRANCH

Venue: Norwich Radiology Academy

CPD: 6 CREDITS

This event will cover important and difficult aspects of GI and HPB radiology. The morning session will focus on imaging of acutely unwell patients, covering difficult cases of bowel obstruction, GI bleeding and trauma, bowel ischaemia, imaging the post-operative abdomen and luminal/hepatobiliary intervention. The afternoon session will focus on the outpatient setting, covering MRI of focal liver lesions and diffuse liver diseases, tips and tricks for staging HPB malignancies, anal fistula MRI, pitfalls in CT colonography, and a debate on MRI vs ultrasound for small bowel imaging.

By the end of this day delegates will have increased confidence in dealing with these difficult GI issues in clinical practice.

- Increase knowledge and understanding of difficult cases in acute abdominal imaging
- Increase knowledge and understanding of difficult GI and HPB cases in the outpatient setting

BY TRAIN

The nearest train station is Norwich which is a 21 minute drive to the venue.

BY BUS

From Norwich train station the following buses go towards the venue and take approximately 40 minutes: Blue Line 25, 26; Green Line 14; and Red Line 23.

From Norwich city centre the following buses go towards the venue and take approximately 18 to 30 minutes: 4, Pink Line 11, Blue Line 26A and 3.

BY CAR

From the A47 take the B1108 (Watton Road) towards Norwich. At the traffic lights turn right, into Colney Lane, this will be signposted to the hospital. Instead of continuing to the hospital take the first left at the next set of traffic lights. Turn immediately left again and follow the road around to the left. The Cotman Centre will be on your left.

There is free parking available at the venue.
